Charlotte, N.C., January 19, 2021 – The Board of Directors of Supportive Housing Communities (SHC), a nonprofit organization dedicated to keeping homeless individuals and families off the streets of Charlotte by providing affordable housing, case management and relevant resources to alleviate homelessness and human suffering, announced that Ms. Sherrill Hampton, CEO, will resign to pursue new opportunities.
