ABOUT THE EVENT

The Brewer's Ball is a unique annual fundraising event that will bring the area's top breweries together for an evening to offer their signature handcrafted microbrew to a limited number of guests in an intimate and exclusive setting. Each Brewery will design their own brew station, prepare two kegs of their featured handcrafted microbrew to serve approximately 300 guests with a tasting sample. Breweries will design their station settings to reflect their brewery and personal flair.

The event will open with a brewery tasting from top breweries, hors d'oeuvres from area participating food truck and restaurant partners, and a silent auction. During the event guests will visit each station to enjoy the various tastings being served and will have the opportunity to learn more about each brewery and their creative methods.

Supportive Housing Communities (SHC) relies on the generosity of people like you to fund groundbreaking services and programs to help our homeless neighbors move into and maintain stable living in their home. We need your time, talent, and treasure. Join us for an exquisite evening hosted by the best breweries in our area supporting this most worthy cause.

BREWERY & RESTAURANT RESPONSIBILITIES

The following are those items for which each participating brewery or restaurant is responsible in the preparation of tastings for 300 guests.

STATION SETTINGS

You are encouraged to bring your own station/table settings to set your station apart and reflect your brand. Station settings may be as elaborate or as simple as desired.

The venue will provide:

(3) 6' rectangular tables formed to a U shape and (2) 6' long preparation tables. The tables will be dressed in floor length black linen. Your space will be roughly 10'X10'.

FOOD

All food will be the responsibility of each restaurant participating as follows: Tastings are served by the time indicated for food service to be completed (three & ½ hours are provided). Each restaurant is asked to provide a copy of their sampling menu so that it may be printed in the evening's Tasting Journal and used to promote your station. The deadline for menu submission is May 10, 2024. You may email your menu to kristina@aplacetoliveagain.org

BEVERAGES

We ask that each brewery provide 2 kegs (or equivalent) of your handcrafted microbrew. You should also bring sampling cups to serve guests. We anticipate 300 guests.

LABOR

You are encouraged to bring staff to assist with the preparations and service that evening. Venue staff and volunteers will provide support for set-up/clean-up and during the event.

PREPARATION AREAS

Each brewery or restaurant will be provided with a preparation area in the kitchen and a preparation area at your station.

AUCTION PARTICIPATION

Each brewery and restaurant is asked to contribute a unique experience as an auction package. All auction experiences are due to SHC by May 20, 2024. Auction details can be emailed to kristina@aplacetoliveagain.org.



ABOUT THE CAUSE
